I. SITUATIONAL OVERVIEW

A. WEATHER UPDATE:

The Municipality of Alegria, Surigao del Norte experienced rainy day weather condition with some rain showers, cloudy skies, some thunderstorm and moderate to strong winds as of reporting date.

B. OPERATIONS CENTER MANAGEMENT UPDATE:

The Operations Center (OpCen) has been operating with MDRRMO under the general supervision of the MDRRMC Chairperson Mayor Rene G. Esma. The following are some significant updates of the OpCen as of reporting date:

1. Received 100 sacks of rice from Congressman Robert Ace Barbers on January 4, 2022.
2. Welcomed some visitors from Palawan Pawnshop on December 29, 2021, and the People in Need and Mindanao Emergency Response Network (MERN) on December 30, 2021 and provided RDANA report and SitRep as of December 24, 2021.
3. Received 10 sacks of rice from Engr. Cipriano M. Vicente, owner of CRV Rice mill ug CRV Petron Gasoline Station on December 29, 2021.
4. Received from people of Panabo City and the City Government of Panabo through their City Mayor Jose E. Relampagos for donating Various Goods such as sacks of Rice, Hygiene Kits, Mineral Waters, milk/cereal, coffee, useful clothes, among others on December 28, 2021.

5. Received the Financial Assistance from the Office of the President amounting to ₱1,080,518.00 and Landbank of the Philippines amounting to ₱100,000.00 both personally handed by the Landbank-Surigao City Manager Charlito Arquion on December 27, 2021.
6. The Caraga State University (CSU) installed solar panel which provides temporary electricity to charge cellular phones and emergency lights for free of charge on Wednesday afternoon, December 22, 2021, at the Municipal Hall, this municipality.
7. The PLGU PSWDO delivered some goods on Wednesday, December 22, 2021, composed of the following:
 - 160 boxes of Family Sardines with 100 cans per box (155g per can)
 - 196 boxes of noodles with 72 packs per box (55g per pack)
8. The PLGU also delivered some 150 sacks of Vietnam Rice on Thursday afternoon, December 23, 2021.
9. The Municipality got some 503 food packs from DSWD Provincial Satellite office, Surigao City on Thursday, December 23, 2021. Some 90 food packs remaining to be taken from the said office since the available vehicle utilized/employed by MLGU were not sufficient to carry the 593 food packs.
10. Welcomed some foreign diplomats, United Nations - OCHA and regional RDANA teams including OCD Caraga Regional Director Liza Mazo along with other regional line agencies on Wednesday, December 22, 2021.

B. Casualties / Injuries

Zero casualty as of reporting date.

The Municipal Health Office (MHO) submitted report on injuries and other illnesses as of December 22, 2021, MHO report as shown below:

- Traumatic Injuries:

 - Injured Resulting from Clearing Operations: **120**

C. Suspension of Classes / Work in Government

There was suspension of work and classes following the issuance of Provincial Executive Order No. 21-045 dated December 15, 2021. The MLGU personnel resumed its office works starting December 20, 2021 (Monday).

D. Status of Lifelines

1. Water Supply

Water supply in the proper areas/barangay is now fully operational and sufficient as reported by Water Works Units of MLGU although there were reported damages within the water system as reported by the Municipal Engineering Office. However, the affected barangay of Pongtud, Budlingin, and Ombong water supply are still to be under assessment for rehabilitation.

2. Roads and Bridges

The Maharlika National Highway within the municipality are passable right after the onset of the typhoon due to the deployment of LGU heavy equipment. There was reported damage of ongoing bridge construction in Barangay Camp Eduard. The roads towards barangay Camp Eduard and Ferlda are still not in good condition due to some landslide and falling trees.

3. Power

Electrical power system in the whole municipal is still not operating and out of service as of reporting date. The MLGU uses some portable generators set in RHU to preserve the COVID-19 vaccine. Some barangay LGU are utilizing generator set to provide temporary source of electricity for the cellular phone charges and flashlights among others.

Some business operations of clearing for falling of trees at houses. On December 23, 2021 (Thursday) around 5:00PM, the MLGU start running its generator set that provide temporary electricity within the municipal hall offices including Christmas lights and provide electrical power for cellular phones, emergency lights, batteries among others from the residents of Alegria, SDN free of charge.

3G gasoline station temporarily opened on Saturday, December 18, 2021, and became fully operational on Sunday, December 19, 2021, and close at 8:00PM. On Wednesday, December 22, 2021, the CRV Petron Gasoline Station start its operations.

4. Communications

Communication via PLDT/SMART and GLOBE signal restored on December 18, 2021 (Saturday) but only on selected part of the municipality especially at Barangay Pongtud and some neighboring parts of barangay in Kitcharao, Agusan del Norte. The phone call and messages signals are stable by December 22, 2021. However, internet signal is still fluctuating as of reporting date.

5. Rural Health Operation

The Municipal Health Office/ Rural Health Unit is functional although portions of the building were damaged. The COVID-19 vaccines are at safe place. The ambulance is running condition and the MHO/RHU personnel are reporting on duty and ready for any call to serve on medical emergencies.

F. Flooded Areas

There was no flooded incidence happened during the onset of the typhoon.

G. Cost of Damage to Infrastructure and Agriculture

Based on the damage report from the Municipal Agriculturist as of December 27, 2021, the total estimated damage for agricultural sector is **₱215,053,025.00**.

The Municipal Engineering Office reported a total estimated damage in infrastructure of **₱93,450,000.00**.

H. Declaration of State of Calamity

The municipality has declared state of calamity due to effect of Typhoon Odette through Sangguniang Bayan Resolution No. 2021-129 series of 2021 dated December 20, 2021, adopting the MDRRMC Resolution No. 21-2021 dated December 17, 2021.

I. Security Status

No reported incident of looting as of reporting date except last December 16, 2021, on the onset of typhoon as reported by Alegria Municipal Police Office. National roads are already safe from motorist while there still ongoing operations for clearing of falling trees that damage some houses.

B. Action Taken


1. Provided the second-round delivery of food relief to 12 barangays on December 30, 2021, utilizing the 150 sacks of rice from PLGU Surigao del Norte and some goods from City of Panabo Government.
2. Posted reports on Typhoon Odette at website (<https://alegriasurigao.wordpress.com/transparency/typhoon-odette-reports/>) and official facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/LGUAlegriaSurigaoDelNorte>) on December 31, 2021.
3. Successfully on full operation the generator set that provide electricity to the Municipal Hall compound on Thursday late afternoon (5:00PM), December 23, 2021. It also provides free electrical power charges for cellphones, batteries, emergency lights, etc. for all residents of Alegria, SDN. Mayor Rene Esma ordered to also extend the electricity to Alegria Municipal Police Station, Integrated Transport Terminal and Streetlights beginning December 24, 2021.
4. Submitted/ furnished reports to concerned agencies (DSWD & PDRRMO on December 18; DILG on December 19; SB on December 20). Also, RDANA and Situational Reports as of December 20, 2021, were given to SOEMCO and Philippine Red Cross – SDN Chapter on December 23 and December 24, People in Need and MERN on December 30, 2021, respectively.
5. Provided electrical power charging for cellular phones, batteries, emergency lights, among others among residents of Alegria, SDN free of charge utilizing the solar electricity provided by Caraga State University on Wednesday, December 22, 2021.
6. The Municipal Health Office/ RHU continue conducted COVID-19 vaccination on December 21 - 23, 2021.
7. Ongoing clearing operations to rescue houses from falling trees in the whole municipality. Clearing of road (national highway and barangay) were completed on December 17-19, 2021.
8. Provision of food relief assistance to some 5,300 families in the whole municipality composed of five (5) kilos of rice spaghetti with ingredients plus ₱100 cash on December 18 (Saturday) and December 19 (Sunday). The MLGU gave one sack of rice per barangay during the Rapid Damage And Needs Assessment (RDANA) on December 17, 2021 (Friday)
9. Conducted RDANA on December 17, 2021 (Friday) composed of three teams with the following:

- Team 1: Barangay Pongtud, San Juan, Alipao, & San Pedro
 - Team 2: Barangay Poblacion, Anahaw, Gamuton & Julio Ouno
 - Team 3: Barangay Ombong, Budlingin, Camp Eduard, & Ferlda
10. Conducted urgent MDRRMC meeting with Punong Barangay/ Representative afternoon on December 17, 2021, together with RDANA team. The MDRRMC recommended for the declaration of state of calamity in the whole municipality on the said day base on the RDANA report.
 11. Conducted initial assessment of the evacuation center during the onset of the typhoon Odette at 5:30PM on December 16, 2021, to barangay except Budlingin, Camp Eduard, and Ferlda. There was initial deployment of team to clear the national roads on the same night.
 12. Lobbied to Sangguniang Bayan during its session on Monday, December 20, 2021. The Sangguniang Bayan (SB) adopted the MDRRMC resolution recommending the declaration state of calamity in the whole municipality. SB issued Resolution No. 2021-129 “Resolution Declaring the Entire Municipality of Alegria, Surigao del Norte Under the State of Calamity Due to Typhoon “ODETTE””.
 13. Conducted meeting with MLGU family (all personnel available) on Monday, December 20, 2021. Clearing operations at the Municipal Hall compound including the clearing of some offices from the debris of typhoon.
 14. Conducted initial Post Damage and Needs Assessment (PDANA) composed of same RDANA team deployed Monday, December 20, 2021. The PDANA report is ongoing consolidation by the PDANA team.
 15. Implementation of BAYANIHAN SYSTEM among BLGU, & MLGU. The MLGU to provide labor cost for chainsaw while BLGU to provide fuel for the chainsaw.
 16. Conducted meeting lead by Municipal Mayor and MDRRMO as needed arises together with LGU heads among others.
